An Act to amend the Prices Act, 1948-1973.

[Assented to 5th December, 1974]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Prices Act Amendment Act, 1974".

Short tities.

(2) The Prices Act, 1948-1973, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

(3) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Prices Act, 1948-1974".

2. Section 53 of the principal Act is repealed and the following section Repeal of s. 53 of principal Act is enacted and inserted in its place:

s. 33 of principal Act and enactment of section in its place--Cessation of effect of certain provisions.

53. Notwithstanding anything in this Act contained, on and from Cessation of effect of cortained of the thirty-first day of December, 1975—

- (a) any goods or services which, pursuant to a proclamation under section 19 of this Act, were immediately before that day declared goods or services shall cease to be declared goods or services, as the case may be, and it shall not be competent for the Governor to make any further proclamation under that section;
- (b) any order in force immediately before that day under section 21 of this Act shall cease to have effect and it shall not be competent for the Minister to make any further order under that section;
- (c) any order in force immediately before that day under section 22a of this Act shall cease to have effect and it shall not be competent for the Minister to make any further order under that section;
- (d) any order in force immediately before that day under section 22f of this Act shall cease to have effect and it shall not be competent for the Minister to make any further order under that section;

(e) any order in force immediately before that day under section 24 of this Act shall cease to have effect and it shall not be competent for the Minister to make any further order under that section.
