An Act to amend the "Police Act, 1869."

[Assented to, November 24th, 1904.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Police Act Amendment Act, 1904," and shall be read and incorporated with the "Police Act, 1869," and all Acts amending the same.

Short title and incorporation.

2. Any person standing or loitering in any street, road, thoroughfare, or footpath, and who shall, after being requested by any police or other constable to move on or cease loitering, neglect or refuse so to do shall be guilty of an offence, and liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not exceeding Forty Shillings; and this section shall be read and construed as if the same had originally formed portion of section 79 of the "Police Act, 1869."

Amendment of sec. 79, Police Act, 1869.
