By His Excellency GEORGE GREY Esquire Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Province of South Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council.

AN ACT to amend an Act intituled "An Act to regulate the Post Office Department in South Australia."

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Council of South Australia passed in the fifth year of Her present Majesty's reign intituled "An Act to regulate the Post Office Department in South Australia" it is enacted *inter alia* that nothing herein contained shall be taken to authorise any charge for postage upon any letter or packet addressed to or franked by any person in Great Britain or Ireland being empowered by law to send or receive letters or packets beyond sea free from postage nor upon any letter newspaper or packet addressed to or franked by the Governor for the time being the Members of Council the Clerk of Council or the Governor's Private Secretary and whereas it is expedient to amend the said Act in this respect:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED BY HIS EXCELLENCY GEORGE GREY Esquire Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Province of South Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of

Repeal of exemption of Members of Council of the same by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That from and after the passing hereof the before recited provision of the said Act shall be and the same is hereby repealed: Provided always that nothing herein or in the said recited Act contained shall be taken to authorise any charge for postage upon any letter or packet addressed to or franked by any person in Great Britain or Ireland being empowered by law to send or receive letters or packets beyond sea free from postage nor upon any letter newspaper or packet addressed to or franked by the Governor for the time being.

Penalty on franking letters not on the public service.

II. And whereas by the same Act it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor for the time being from time to time to exempt from postage as to him shall appear expedient all letters and packets (being *bona fide* on the public service) which shall be addressed to or written and franked by such Public Officers of the Government as he shall deem it expedient from time to time to name for that purpose provided there be written thereon by the person sending the same the words "on public service" and that underneath those words there be subscribed by him his signature be it enacted that if any such officer shall write the said words and subscribe his signature on any letter or packet not *bona fide* relating to the public service he shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than five pounds nor more than fifty pounds sterling to be sued for recovery and applied in manner provided by the said recited Act.
