An Act to amend the Payment of Members of Parliament Act, 1948.

[Assented to 6th September, 1951.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the " Payment of Members of Parliament Act Amendment Act, 1951 ".

(2) The Payment of Members of Parliament Act, 1948, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the " Payment of Members of Parliament Act, 1948-1951 ".

(3) The Payment of Members of Parliament Act, 1948, is hereinafter referred to as " the principal Act ".

Incorporation.

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act.

3. Section 4 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out the words " nine hundred " in the third line of paragraph (a) and inserting in lieu thereof the words " eleven hundred and fifty " ;

(b) by striking out the words " nine hundred and fifty " in the fourth and fifth lines of paragraph (b) and inserting in lieu thereof the words " twelve hundred " ;

- (c) by striking out the words " nine hundred and seventy-five " in the third and fourth lines of paragraph (c) and inserting in their place " twelve hundred and twenty-five ".

4. Section 5 of the principal Act is amended—

- (a) by striking out the word " Four " in the fourth and fifth lines and inserting in its place in each case the word " Six " ;
- (b) by inserting after the words " Two hundred " in the seventh line the words " and fifty " ;
- (c) by striking out the word " Three " in the last line and inserting in its place the word " Five ".

5. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of July nineteen hundred and fifty-one.
