An Act to provide for the preservation of Pension Rights under the Police Pensions Act, 1929, to Maurice John Murphy.

[Assented to, September 8th, 1932.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Pensions Act, 1932". Short titles.

(2) The Police Pensions Act, 1929, (which is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act"), the Police Pensions Act, 1930, and this Act may be cited together as the "Police Pensions Acts, 1929 to 1932". No. 1917 of 1929. No. 1952 of 1930.

2. (1) Section 3 of the principal Act is amended—

Amendment of principal Act, s. 3—
Preservation of pension rights.

(a) by inserting before the word "shall" in the fourth line of subsection (2) thereof the passage "and Maurice John Murphy, Acting Superintendent of the Yatala Labour Prison (who is at the passing of the Police Pensions Act, 1932, employed in the Public Service, but has previously been a member of the Force)"; and

(b) by adding at the end of subsection (2) thereof the words "Provided that upon the said Maurice John Murphy attaining the age of sixty years he shall (without affecting any other pension rights given to him under this Act) be entitled to a pension under this Act as

on retirement notwithstanding that the said Maurice John Murphy is and continues to be employed in the Public Service: Provided further that after attaining the said age of sixty years the said Maurice John Murphy shall not be obliged to contribute to the South Australian Superannuation Fund under the Superannuation Act, 1926, notwithstanding that he is and continues to be employed in the Public Service”.

(2) The amendments made by this section shall be deemed to have been made on and to take effect from the fourteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and thirty-two.
