An Act to amend the Public Service Act, 1967-1978.

[Assented to 19 March 1981]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Public Service Act Amendment Act, 1981".

(2) The Public Service Act, 1967-1978, is in this Act referred to as "the principal Act".

(3) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Public Service Act, 1967-1981".

Insertion of new s. 36a.

Reduction in salary arising from refusal or failure to carry out duties lawfully assigned. 2. The following section is inserted after section 36 of the principal Act:

36a. (1) Where, in consequence or in furtherance of industrial action, an officer refuses or fails to carry out duties that he is lawfully required to perform, he shall not, if the Board so directs, be paid salary for a day or days on which he refuses or fails to carry out those duties or persists in that refusal or failure.

(2) A direction may be given under subsection (1) notwithstanding that, on a day or days to which the direction relates, the officer has performed some (but not all) of the duties that he is lawfully required to perform.

(3) In this section—

"day" includes a part of a day:

"salary" includes prescribed allowances.
