## No. 45 of 1979

### An Act to amend the Road Traffic Act, 1961-1976.

[Assented to 15th March, 1979]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

**Short titles.**

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Road Traffic Act Amendment Act (No. 2), 1979".

(2) The Road Traffic Act, 1961-1976, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

(3) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Road Traffic Act, 1961-1979".

**Commence-  
ment.**

2. This Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation.

**Repeal of  
ss. 82, 83 and  
84 of

3. Sections 82, 83 and 84 of the principal Act are repealed.

**Amendment of  
principal Act  
s. 176—  
Regulations.**

4. Section 176 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out from paragraph (c) of subsection (1) the passage "or standing" and inserting in lieu thereof the passage ", standing or parking";

(b) by inserting after paragraph (c) of subsection (1) the following paragraph:—

(caa) providing that the owner and the driver of a vehicle that was parked or was standing in contravention of any regulation under this section relating to the parking or standing of vehicles shall each be guilty of an offence and liable to the prescribed penalty; ;

(c) by inserting after paragraph (n) of subsection (1) the following paragraph:—

(na) providing defences for persons charged with offences against any regulations under this section; ;

(d) by striking out from paragraph (o) of subsection (1) the passage "one hundred dollars" and inserting in lieu thereof the passage "two hundred dollars";

and

(e) by inserting after subsection (5) the following subsection:—

(6) No person shall commence proceedings for an offence against any regulation under this section relating to the parking or standing of vehicles, without the prior approval of the Commissioner of Police.
