An Act to apply, out of the General Revenue, the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds to the Public Service for the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight.

[Assented to 29th July, 1937.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. Out of the General Revenue of the State there shall be issued and applied, from time to time, for the public service of the State for the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of eight hundred thousand pounds.

Issue and application of £800,000.

2. No payments for any establishment or service shall be made out of the said sum in excess of the rates voted for similar establishments or services on the Estimates for the financial year ended the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, except such payments as are necessary to pay any annual increases of salary fixed by—

Payments not to exceed last year's Estimates.

- (a) any return which has been made by the Classification and Efficiency Board under the Public Service Act, 1936, or any previous Act relating to the Public Service, and is for the time being in force; or
- (b) any regulation made by the South Australian Railways Commissioner and confirmed by the Governor-in-Council and for the time being in force:

Provided that this section shall not authorise the payment of any increase whereby any salary is increased to a sum exceeding two hundred and eighty-seven pounds per annum.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
