An Act to amend the Agent-General Act, 1901-1953, the Audit Act, 1921-1957, the Industrial Code, 1920-1960, the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1961, the Police Regulation Act, 1952-1955, and the Public Service Act, 1936-1959, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 28th November, 1963.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Statutes Amendment Short titles. (Public Salaries) Act, 1963".
- 2.  - and fifty" in subsection (1) thereof and inserting salary of in lieu thereof the words "five thousand"; and President and Deputy President.

(b) by striking out the words "three thousand six hundred and seventy-five" in subsection (2) thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words "four thousand two hundred and fifty".

Amendment of Public Service Arbitration Act, 1961, s. 4 (1)— Salary of Public Service Arbitrator.

5. Subsection (1) of section 4 of the Public Service Arbitration Act, 1961, is amended by striking out the symbol and figures "£4,350" (twice occurring) therein and inserting in lieu thereof the symbol and figures "£4,800" in each case.

Amendment of Police Regulation Act. 1952-1955, 8-8-Salary of Commissioner of Police.

Amendment of Commissioner (a) by

- 6. Section 8 of the Police Regulation Act, 1952-1955, is amended—
 - (a) by striking out the words "four thousand two hundred" in subsection (1) thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words "four thousand eight hundred";
 - (b) by striking out the word "thirty" in subsection (2) thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words "fifty-five".

Amendment of Public Service Act, 1936-1959, 5, 17— Salary of Public Service Commissioner.

7. Section 17 of the Public Service Act, 1936-1959, as amended from time to time, is amended by striking out the words "four thousand five hundred" in subsection (1) thereof and inserting in their place the words "five thousand one hundred and fifty pounds".

Operation of increases in salaries.

8. The rates of salary fixed by sections 2 to 7 (inclusive) of this Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-three.

Arrears.

- 9. (1) The arrears of salary payable to any person by virtue of this Act may be paid in one sum.
- (2) This Act shall, without further appropriation, be sufficient authority for the payment of all such arrears.
