An Act to amend the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1969.

[Assented to 17th September, 1970.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Supreme Court Act Amendment Act, 1970".

(2) The Supreme Court Act, 1935-1969, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Supreme Court Act, 1935-1970".

(3) The Supreme Court Act, 1935-1969, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

2. Section 62c of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out subsection (3) and inserting in lieu thereof the following subsections :—

(3) The Governor may, by proclamation, confer the jurisdiction of the Court upon any judge of the Supreme Court.

(3a) The Governor may, by proclamation, divest any judge of the jurisdiction of the Court and confer that jurisdiction upon any other judge;

and

(b) by striking out from subsection (4) the passage "by instrument published in the *Gazette*, confer temporarily or permanently the jurisdiction of the

Court upon any other judge” and inserting in lieu thereof the passage “by proclamation confer temporarily or permanently the jurisdiction of the Court upon any additional judge”.

3. Section 62h of the principal Act is amended by inserting after subsection (3) the following subsection :—

(3a) The rules may provide for an appeal against a decision or order of the master made in the exercise of any jurisdiction conferred on him under this Part to a judge upon whom the jurisdiction of the Court has been conferred.
