An Act to authorize the Sale of Railways.

[Assented to, 9th December, 1864.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to authorize the Governor to sell Preamble.
Railways, the property of the Crown, or vested in or under the control of any person or Board on behalf of the Crown—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows :

1. The Governor may sell any railway, or tramway, and any jetty, station, or works connected with the same, the property of the Crown, or vested in or under the control of the Commissioner of Railways, or any other person or Board on behalf of the Crown, by public auction or private contract, and subject to such terms and conditions as to him may seem meet, and may do all acts which may be necessary to vest any railway so sold in the purchaser thereof. Governor may sell railways, &c.

2. On the sale of any railway, tramway, or jetty, as aforesaid being completed, the person in whom the same shall be for the time being vested, shall have the same rights, powers, and responsibilities as were possessed by or imposed upon the Commissioner of Railways by virtue of the Acts under which the same were vested in him. On sale, powers, &c., vested in Commissioner to vest in purchaser.

3. The purchaser shall take any railway or tramway so sold subject to the provisions of any general law affecting railways in the said Province, and to any Act or Acts regulating the railway or tramway so sold.
