An Act to amend Act No. 161 of 1879, intituled "An Act to remedy some of the Evils arising from Betting at Races."

[Assented to, November 17th, 1882.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend Act No. 161 of 1879—Be Preamble.
it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows :

1. No such totalizator machine or instrument as is mentioned in the said Act shall be used more than eight days on any racecourse in any one year : Provided no club shall charge more than five per cent. on any moneys placed in the totalizator, under a penalty not exceeding Five Hundred Pounds for every day a higher charge is made by such club. Totalizator not to be used more than eight days in the year.

2. Any person using any such totalizator machine or instrument contrary to the provisions of this Act, shall be deemed to have exercised a lottery within the meaning of "The Lottery and Gaming Act, 1875," and shall be liable accordingly. Penalty for infringement of Act.

3. This Act and the Act No. 161 of 1879 shall be read and construed together as forming one Act. Incorporation.
