An Act to amend the Taxation Acts.

[Assented to, November 27th, 1895.]

**B**E it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Taxation Acts Amendment Act, 1895," and shall be incorporated with the "Taxation Act, 1884," and the Acts amending the same.

Short title and incorporation.

**2.** For the period of the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, section 2 of the "Taxation Act Amendment Act, 1887," is hereby amended by striking out the words "Two Hundred Pounds" in sub-division II. thereof, and by inserting the words "One Hundred and Twenty-five Pounds" in lieu thereof.

Reduction of exemption to One Hundred and Twenty-five Pounds.

**3.** For the period of the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, if the taxable amount of the income from all sources of a taxpayer in his sole individual right shall exceed Three Hundreds Pounds, he shall be entitled to no deduction by way of exemption from income tax.

Abolition of exemption in case taxable amount of income exceeds Three Hundred Pounds.
