An Act to provide for a Site for the Adelaide Gunpowder Magazine.

[Assented to, August 30th, 1882.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. The Commissioner of Public Works may take possession of all that portion of the Gaol Reserve, City of Adelaide, described in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of erecting thereon suitable buildings for gunpowder magazines. Certain land may be taken for gunpowder magazines.

2. This Act may be cited as "The Adelaide Gunpowder Magazines Act." Short title.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.

THE SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Commencing at a point on the western side of the gaol reserve 819 links northerly from its south-west corner; thence easterly at an angle of $89^{\circ} 42'$ for 125 links; thence northerly at an angle of $89^{\circ} 42'$ for 135 links; thence easterly at right-angles for 140 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of 150° for 180 links; thence north-westerly at right-angles for 234 links; thence south-westerly at right angles for 180 links; thence westerly at an angle of 150° to the western boundary of gaol reserve aforesaid; thence southerly along said boundary to the point of commencement.
