An Act to amend Act No. 418 of 1887, relating to Treasury Bills, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, September 7th, 1892.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1. “The Treasury Bills Amendment Act, 1891,” is hereby repealed. Repeal.

2. Section 6 of Act No. 418 of 1887, intituled “An Act to provide for the raising of a sum not exceeding One Million One Hundred Thousand Pounds by the issue of Treasury Bills, and for other purposes,” shall be read and construed as if the words “not exceeding” had been inserted in the ninth line of that section, immediately preceding the word “Threepence.”

Amendment of section 6 of Act 418 of 1887.

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the said Act No. 418 of 1887, any Treasury Bill issued under the provisions of the said Act may be issued for any such sum as the Treasurer for the time being of the said province may from time to time determine, and any Treasury Bill issued under the said Act, and the coupons attached thereto, may be issued as payable to the person named in any such Bill or coupons, or to the order of such person, and shall be so payable accordingly.

Treasury Bills may be issued for such sums as the Treasurer may determine, and may be made payable to the person named therein, or order.

4. This Act may be cited as “The Treasury Bills Amendment Act, 1892,” and shall be incorporated and read as one with the said Act No. 418 of 1887.
