An Act Confirming the Appointment of Persons required to take the Oath of Office and Allegiance.

[Assented to October 16th, 1901.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as “The Confirmation of Appointments Act, 1901.” Short title.

2. The oath of office and the oath of allegiance heretofore taken to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, whereby any person is now holding any commission, office, or appointment under the Crown shall be deemed to have been taken to His Majesty King Edward the Seventh, and each such oath so taken, commission granted, or office or appointment so made is hereby confirmed, and shall have the same force and effect and be as valid and effectual for all purposes whatsoever as if the same had been taken to, or granted, or made by His Majesty King Edward the Seventh. Confirmation of oath of office and allegiance.

3. All acts, deeds, matters, and things executed and done by any such person since the decease of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria shall, where the same would have been lawfully executed and done if such oath had been therebefore taken to, and such commission granted or office or appointment made by, His Majesty King Edward the Seventh, have the full force and effect of law, and be valid and effectual for all purposes whatsoever, and are hereby confirmed. Confirmation of acts, etc., executed and done by persons under appointment.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
