An Act to further amend "The Hospitals Act, 1867."

[Assented to, October 2nd, 1912.]

E it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as "The Hospitals Act Short title. Amendment Act, 1912."
- (2) "The Hospitals Act, 1867," "The Hospitals Act Amend- No. 7 of 1867. ment Act, 1884," and this Act, may be cited together as "The No. 306 of 1884. Hospitals Acts, 1867 to 1912."
- 2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in Incorporation with section 1, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. other Acts.
- 3. Section 12 of "The Hospitals Act, 1867," is amended by Amendment of section striking out all the remainder of the section after the word 12 of principal Act. "hospital" in the seventh line thereof and substituting the dismissal of officers. following words in place of the words so struck out, namely:

"and may appoint such medical and other officers, nurses, attendants, and other persons as to such Board may seem necessary for the requirements of such hospital, and may dismiss such officers, nurses, attendants, and persons: Provided that, as regards offices and positions specified with respect to such hospital in a proclamation by the Governor published in the Government Gazette, and for the time being in force, no appointment

appointment or dismissal shall be made without the approval of the Governor first obtained, and that, as regards other offices and positions, no appointment or dismissal shall be made without the approval of the Chief Secretary first obtained.

The Governor may, from time to time, make and rescind or vary such proclamations, and any such proclamation shall come into force upon the publication thereof in the Government Gazette."

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
