An Act to amend the Lottery and Gaming Act Amendment Act, No. 426 of 1888.

[Assented to, November 13th, 1902.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend "The Lottery and Gaming Act Amendment Act, 1888"—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia, as follows: Preamble.

1. This Act may be cited as "The Lottery and Gaming Act Further Amendment Act, 1902." Short title.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of "The Lottery and Gaming Act Amendment Act, 1888," the Commissioner of Police, subject to the approval of the Chief Secretary, may issue a licence, in terms of the said Act and regulations thereunder, for the use of the totalizator on the racecourses used by the following racing clubs, viz. :—Jamestown Jockey Club, North-western Jockey Club, and Quorn Jockey Club, irrespective of the distance of such racecourse from any other licensed course: Provided that such racing club shall consist of at least fifty members, whose annual subscriptions shall amount to not less than Fifty Pounds. Amendment of Act 426 of 1888, clause 6.
