An Act to Extend the Time for making Payment of Fees in respect of Patents, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, October 1st, 1902.]

E it Enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia as follows: the Parliament of South Australia, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Patent Act Amendment Act, Short title and 1902," and shall be read and incorporated with "The Patent Act, incorporation. 1877," and all Acts amending the same.

2. Where a patentee through accident or inadvertence fails to make Patentee failing to any prescribed payment within the prescribed time he may, notwithstanding the provisions of "The Patent Act, 1877," apply to the Commissioner for an extension of the time for making such payment.

## The Patent Act Amendment Act.—1902.

Where proceedings taken after failure of payment and before extension Court may refuse to award damages. (b) If any proceeding be taken in respect of an infringement of the patent committed after a failure to make any payment within the prescribed time and before the extension thereof, the Court before which proceedings are taken shall not award or give any damages in respect of such infringement.

Act retrospective.

4. This Act shall be retrospective.
