An Act to amend the "Promissory Oaths Act, 1869," and for other purposes.

[Assented to, September 7th, 1911.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as "The Promissory Oaths Amendment Act, 1911." Short title.

(2) The "Promissory Oaths Act, 1869" (hereinafter called "the principal Act"), and this Act may be cited together as "The Promissory Oaths Acts, 1869 and 1911." No. 6 of 1869-70.

2. This Act is incorporated and shall be read with the principal Act. Incorporation.

3. The form of official oath contained in section 3 of the principal Act is repealed, and the form following is enacted and substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say— New form of official oath.

4. The form of judicial oath contained in section 4 of the principal Act is repealed, and the form following is enacted and substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say— New form of judicial oath.

I, _____, do swear that I will well and truly serve _____

serve Our Sovereign Lord King George the Fifth, His Heirs and Successors, according to law, in the office of _____, and I will do right to all manner of people after the laws and usages of this State, without fear or favor, affection or illwill.—So HELP ME GOD!

The name of the Sovereign for the time being, to be used.

5. Where in any form of oath prescribed by this Act the name of His present Majesty is expressed, the name of the Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland for the time being shall be used.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
