An Act to amend The Teachers Superannuation Act, 1890.

[Assented to, October 4th, 1928.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as the "Teachers Super- Short titles.
annuation Act Amendment Act, 1928."

(2) The Teachers Superannuation Acts, 1890 to 1922, and this Act may be cited together as the "Teachers Superannuation Acts, 1890 to 1928."

(3) The Teachers Superannuation Act, 1890, is hereinafter called "the principal Act."

2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in Incorporation.
section 1 of this Act, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act.

3. Section 2 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the Amendment of

Definition of
subscriber.
definition of "Subscriber" therein and inserting in lieu thereof the following definition :—

"Subscriber"—A person who—

(a) is subscribing to the Fund under section 13 of this Act or having commenced so to subscribe is temporarily excused by the Board from subscribing; or

(b) has

(b) has subscribed to the Fund and has accepted from the Board a paid up annuity contract as provided for in section 64 of the Superannuation Act, 1926.

4. Sections 5 and 6 of the principal Act are repealed and the following section is hereby enacted and substituted in lieu thereof:—

Repeal of ss. 5 and 6 of principal Act, and re-enactment of s. 5—
Constitution of Board.

5. (1) The Board shall consist of seven members, of whom three shall be appointed by the Governor and four shall be subscribers or annuitants elected by the subscribers and annuitants in manner prescribed. One of the members appointed to the Board by the Governor shall be an officer of the Education Department and shall be appointed as the executive officer of the Board. If any person appointed as such executive officer ceases to be an officer of the Education Department he shall forthwith cease to hold office as a member of the Board and as the executive officer thereof.

(2) Each of the members of the Board in office at the time of the commencement of the Teachers Superannuation Act Amendment Act, 1928, except the executive officer of the Board, shall continue in office for the balance of the term for which he was originally appointed. The executive officer of the Board shall continue to be a member of the Board so long as he holds office as such executive officer.

(3) Every subsequent member of the Board, except the executive officer of the Board, shall hold office for six years. Every subsequent executive officer shall continue to be a member of the Board so long as he holds office as such executive officer.

(4) When a member of the Board ceases to hold office by effluxion of time, or if the member is the executive officer of the Board, because he is no longer an officer of the Education Department, his successor shall be appointed—

(a) by the Governor, if the retiring member was appointed by the Governor or by the Board in place of a member appointed by the Governor:

(b) in any other case by the subscribers and annuitants.

(5) Any retiring member of the Board shall be eligible for re-appointment or re-election.

Amendment of principal Act, s. 7—
Consequential amendment.

5. Section 7 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after the word "subscriber" in the thirteenth line thereof the words "or annuitant".

Amendment of principal Act, s. 11—
Application of fund.

6. Section 11 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out the words "who is not employed in the public service" in the fourth and fifth lines thereof;

(b) by striking out the words "on their retirement from service" in the sixth and seventh lines thereof; and

(c) by

(c) by inserting after the word “subscribers” in the tenth and in the eleventh line the words “or annuitants”.

7. Section 13 of the principal Act is repealed, and the following section is hereby enacted and substituted in lieu thereof:—

Re-enactment of s. 13 of principal Act—

13. (1) The following persons may be subscribers to the Fund:—

Voluntary subscribers.

(a) any person who is a subscriber at the commencement of the Teachers Superannuation Act Amendment Act, 1928:

(b) with the permission of the Board, any person employed in or by the Education Department.

(2) No subscriber to the Fund shall, whilst employed in or by the Education Department, cease to be a subscriber without the consent of the Board.

(3) The Minister may pay any subscriptions becoming due by any subscriber, and deduct the same from his salary.

8. Section 17 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after the word “subscribers” in the second line of paragraph (c) and in the first line of paragraph (i) the words “and annuitants”.

Consequential Amendment.

9. Sections 2 and 3 of the Teachers Superannuation Amendment Act, 1897, are repealed.

Repeal of ss. 2 and 3 of Act 684 of 1897—
Consequential repeal.
