## No. 849.

An Act to Abolish the Exemption of Stamp Duty on Receipts given for Payments made by the Crown.

[*Assented to, November 8th, 1904.*]

**B**E it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

**1.** This Act may be cited as “The Stamp Act Further Amendment Act, 1904,” and shall be incorporated and read with “The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1902,” and all Acts amending the same.

Short title and incorporation.

**2.** The Second Schedule of “The Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1902,” so far as the same refers to exemptions of stamps on receipts, is amended by striking out of sub-section 1 the following words:—  
“Every instrument for effecting the payment of money, or for acknowledging any payment, or receipt by, to, or on behalf of His Majesty or any public department, or”

Amendment as to stamps on receipts.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
