An Act to further amend an Act, No. 76 of 1877, being
“An Act to provide for the formation of a Line
of Railway from Kadina to Wallaroo.”

[Assented to, September 15th, 1886.]

WHEREAS the Wallaroo railway station and yards have been for Preamble.
some time past insufficient for the traffic thereon, and it has
been found necessary to extend the same, and to make sidings and
other works for the accommodation of the public, and for the pur-
poses aforesaid, and in order to obtain better approaches to the
Wallaroo railway pier, to take additional lands, and to use certain
streets and open another street instead thereof: And whereas the
said works have been carried out accordingly: And whereas it
is expedient that the said works and the taking and using of the
said lands and streets should be validated, and their continuance
lawfully authorised: And whereas a plan showing the land so
taken, and the portions of streets so closed and opened, signed “H.
C. Mais, Engineer-in-Chief, 22/6/86,” has been deposited in the
office of the Surveyor-General, at Adelaide—Be it therefore Enacted
by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly,
in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. The Commissioner of Railways, hereinafter called “the said
Commissioner,” may exercise over and in respect of the lands des-
cribed in the First and Second Schedules hereto, all or any of
the rights, powers, and privileges vested in him by virtue of the Act
No. 76 of 1877, intituled “An Act to provide for the formation of
a Line of Railway from Kadina to Wallaroo,” as if the same were
the lands described in the plans mentioned in the Preamble to the
said Act.

Commissioner to have
powers over lands in
First and Second
Schedules.

2. The

The Wallaroo Railway Station Extension Act.—1886.

Lands to vest in the Crown, and power over same.

2. The lands described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby vested in Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, and the said Commissioner may exercise over and in respect of the said lands all or any of the rights, powers, and privileges aforesaid.

Exemption from liability to actions.

3. The said Commissioner and all persons concerned are hereby released from all causes of action or liabilities, if any, incurred by him or them by reason of the taking or using of the said recited lands or streets, or by reason of the carrying out of the said recited works, or any of them.

Surveyor-General to keep plan.

4. The Surveyor-General shall keep the said plan and all documents deposited with him for the purposes of this Act, and shall allow all persons interested to inspect the same.

Lands exempt from rates and taxes.

5. The lands described in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto shall be exempt from all rates and taxes whatsoever whether local or general.

Land to be a public street.

6. The land described in the Fourth Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a public street within the meaning of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1880," and the Acts incorporated therewith.

Short title.

7. This Act shall be cited for all purposes as "The Wallaroo Railway Station Extension Act, 1886."

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

Crown Lands, Hundred of Wallaroo.

1. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point on the north-eastern side of Johns-terrace, town of Wallaroo, 113 links from the northern intersection of Lydia-terrace and Johns-terrace; thence south-easterly along said side of Johns-terrace for 734 links; thence east-south-easterly at an angle of $166^{\circ} 32'$ for 30 links; thence easterly at an angle of $144^{\circ} 23'$ for 368 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $143^{\circ} 3'$ for 72 links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $79^{\circ} 6'$ for $631\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence west-north-westerly at an angle of $172^{\circ} 15'$ for 281 links; thence west-south-westerly at an angle of $137^{\circ} 20'$ for 234 links to the point of commencement.

2. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at the intersection of the south-western side of Owen-terrace, town of Wallaroo, with the production south-westerly of the north-western side of Irwine-street; thence south-westerly at an angle of $97^{\circ} 39'$ from said side of Owen-terrace for $230\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence south-easterly at an angle of $93^{\circ} 53'$ for $14\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence southerly at an angle of $116^{\circ} 21'$ for 12 links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $63^{\circ} 31'$ for 1,019 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $88^{\circ} 55'$ for $39\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $90^{\circ} 8'$ for $261\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $88^{\circ} 33'$ for 277 links to the south-western side of Owen-terrace; thence south-easterly at an angle of $89^{\circ} 2'$ along said side of terrace for $1,233\frac{1}{2}$ links to the point of commencement.

3. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point on the north-eastern side of Johns-terrace, town of Wallaroo, 296 links south-easterly from the bend in aforesaid terrace, nearly opposite Wildman-street; thence south-easterly along said side of terrace for 1,234 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $97^{\circ} 35'$ for 283 links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $84^{\circ} 3'$ for $1,296\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence west-south-westerly at an angle of $104^{\circ} 3'$ for 54 links; thence south-westerly at an angle of $164^{\circ} 38'$ for 40 links; thence south-south-westerly at an angle of $170^{\circ} 3'$ for 236 links to the point of commencement.

4. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point being the production south-westerly of the south-eastern side of Irwine-street, town of Wallaroo, 318 links from the western corner of allotment 193; thence south-easterly at an angle of $84^{\circ} 30'$ from said production for 1,469 links; thence south-westerly at an angle of $94^{\circ} 27'$ for 42 links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $84^{\circ} 57'$ for 1,502 links; thence easterly at an angle of 47° for $19\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence south-easterly at an angle of $136^{\circ} 44'$ for $12\frac{1}{2}$ links to the point of commencement.

5. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point being the production south-westerly of the north-western side of May-street, town of Wallaroo, 345 links from the south corner of allotment 188; thence south-easterly at an angle of $85^{\circ} 40'$ from said production for 209 links; thence west-south-westerly at an angle of $50^{\circ} 37'$ for 13 links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $130^{\circ} 56'$ for 1,432 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $85^{\circ} 26'$ for $22\frac{1}{2}$ links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $87^{\circ} 25'$ for 16 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $93^{\circ} 33'$ for 13 links; thence south-easterly at an angle of $86^{\circ} 53'$ for 1,251 links to the point of commencement.

6. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point on the western side of Santo-terrace, town of Wallaroo, 237 links from the southern intersection of Owen-terrace and Santo-terrace; thence north-westerly at an angle of $82^{\circ} 27'$ from Santo-terrace for 349 links; thence south-westerly at an angle of $111^{\circ} 44'$ for 36 links; thence south-easterly at an angle of $70^{\circ} 29'$ for 357 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $95^{\circ} 20'$ for 49 links along side of terrace aforesaid to the point of commencement.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

Portion of Park Lands north-west of Lydia-terrace, Town of Wallaroo, Hundred of Wallaroo.

7. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point on the southern side of the street north of the aforesaid park lands, 264 links easterly from the bend in street opposite to and in a line with the boundary between allotments 242 and 243; thence easterly along said side of street for 517 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $135^{\circ} 10'$ for 29 links; thence easterly at an angle of $135^{\circ} 56'$ for 131 links; thence south-westerly at an angle of $40^{\circ} 29'$ for 109 links; thence westerly at an angle of $138^{\circ} 47'$ for 600 links; thence northerly at right angles for 50 links to the point of commencement.

8. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at the intersection of the north-western side of Lydia-terrace with the north-eastern side of Johns-terrace; thence east-north-easterly by the production of said side of Lydia-terrace for 175 links; thence westerly, west-south-westerly, and north-easterly along the southern, south-eastern, and north-western boundaries of the Wallaroo railway station-yard to the southern side of street south of allotment 256; thence generally in a south-westerly direction along the south-eastern side of street aforesaid to a point 105 links north-easterly from the bend in said street south of allotment 247; thence easterly at an angle of $44^{\circ} 4'$ from said street for 152 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $139^{\circ} 6'$ for 343 links; thence east-north-easterly at an angle of $159^{\circ} 32'$ for 1,564 links; thence easterly by a curve of 18 chains radius for 1,250 links to the point of commencement.

THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

Streets Closed—Town of Wallaroo, Hundred of Wallaroo.

A. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at the southern corner of allotment 247; thence north-north-easterly along the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 247, 248, and 249 for 575 links; thence east-north-easterly at an angle of $156^{\circ} 23'$ for 175 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of 174° for 602 links; thence north-easterly by a curve of 850 links radius for 128 links; thence north-north-easterly by a line parallel to and 48 links south-east of the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 254 and 255 for 290 links; thence north-easterly by a curve of 5 chains radius for 194 links; thence easterly by a line parallel to and 45 links south of the southern boundary of allotment 256 for 217 links; thence south-south-easterly at an angle of $106^{\circ} 22'$ for 56 links; thence westerly at an angle of $73^{\circ} 38'$ for 314 links; thence south-westerly at an angle of $153^{\circ} 42'$ for 508 links; thence west-south-westerly at an angle of $165^{\circ} 28'$ for 399 links; thence south-westerly at an angle of $169^{\circ} 59'$ for 318½ links; thence about south-south-westerly at an angle of $168^{\circ} 52'$ for 550 links; thence westerly at an angle of $135^{\circ} 56'$ for 592 links; thence west-north-westerly at an angle of $142^{\circ} 12'$ for 50 links to the southern boundary of allotment 243; thence easterly along portion of the southern boundary of said allotment and the southern boundaries of allotments 244, 245, and 246 for 520 links to the point of commencement.

B. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point on the southern side of the street north of the park lands aforesaid, 264 links easterly from the bend in street opposite to and in a line with the boundary between allotments 242 and 243; thence easterly along said side of street for 517 links; thence north-easterly at an angle of $135^{\circ} 10'$ for 29 links; thence westerly at an angle of $44^{\circ} 4'$ for 542 links; thence southerly at right angles for 20 links to the point of commencement.

C. A piece of land bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at the northern intersection of Lydia-terrace and Johns-terrace, opposite the north-eastern corner of allotment 66; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern side of Johns-terrace for 113 links; thence east-north-easterly at an angle of $117^{\circ} 39'$ for 234 links; thence north-westerly at an angle of $47^{\circ} 40'$ for 135 links; thence west-south-westerly at an angle of $132^{\circ} 20'$ for 201 links to the point of commencement.

THE FOURTH SCHEDULE.

Street Opened—Town of Wallaroo, Hundred of Wallaroo.

D. A piece of land, bounded as follows (that is to say):—Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of allotment 243, 154 links easterly from its south-western corner; thence east-north-easterly at an angle of $24^{\circ} 45'$ from said boundary for 50 links; thence north-north-easterly at an angle of $128^{\circ} 32'$ for 62 links; thence easterly at an angle of $125^{\circ} 4'$ along the sea-wall for 1,150 links; thence west-south-westerly at an angle of $12^{\circ} 26'$ for 111 links to the east corner of allotment 249; thence west-south-westerly at an angle of $168^{\circ} 52'$ for 40 links; thence westerly at an angle of $156^{\circ} 30'$ for 832 links; thence westerly by a curve of 450 links radius for 134 links; thence south-south-westerly for 68 links to a point on the southern boundary of allotment 243, 10 links from its south-eastern corner; thence westerly along said boundary for 90 links to the point of commencement.
