

ARCHITECTS.

No. 34 of 1958.

AN ACT to amend the *Architects Act 1929*.

[11 July 1958.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Architects Act 1958*. Short title and citation.
- (2) The *Architects Act 1929*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section nineteen of the Principal Act is amended— Prohibited practices.

- (a) by omitting from subsection (3) the words “, or any abbreviation thereof,”;
- (b) by inserting after that subsection the following subsection:—

“ (3A) A contravention of subsection (3) of this section is committed when a person thereby forbidden to take or use the name ‘architect’ calls himself, or causes others to call him or believe him to be, an architect, whether or not he has any foreign architectonic qualification, academic, statutory, or otherwise obtained.”; and

- (c) by omitting from subsection (4) the word “twenty” and substituting therefor the word “fifty”.
