

HOBART MARINE BOARD LOAN.

No. 40 of 1962.

AN ACT to amend the *Hobart Marine Board Loan Act 1947.* [12 October 1962.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Hobart Marine Board Loan Act 1962.*

(2) The *Hobart Marine Board Loan Act 1947*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Borrowing powers.

2 Section three of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (1) thereof the numerals “1,500,000” and substituting therefor the numerals “2,500,000”.

APPROPRIATION 1962-1963.

No. 41 of 1962.

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1963, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year. [12 October 1962.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act 1962-1963.*

Issue and application of £12,234,851.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1963 the sum of £12,234,851.

3 The sums granted by this Act and by the *Supply Act* 1962-1963 out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1963, amounting as appears by the first schedule to the sum of £17,976,951, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated, as from the first day of July 1962, for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule in relation to the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1963.
