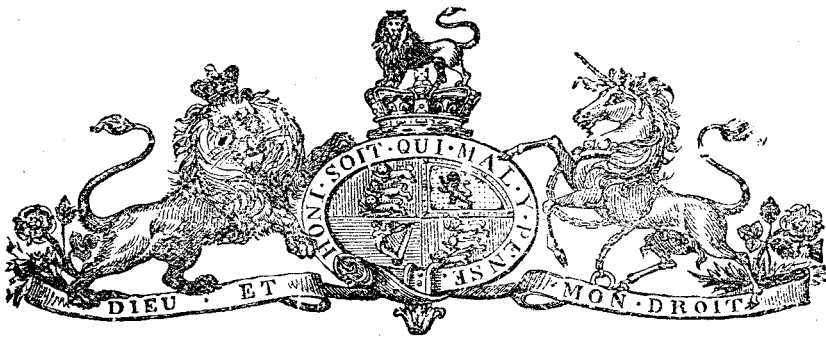

AN ACT to appropriate certain Sums of A.D. 1896.  
Money in aid of the Consolidated Revenue  
Fund of *Tasmania*. [30 October, 1896.]

**W**HEREAS under and in pursuance of the provisions of *The* PREAMBLE.  
*Escheat Act, 1869*, certain properties which formerly belonged to the  
persons deceased, named in the Schedule to this Act, have become  
escheated to Her Majesty the Queen ; and such properties having been  
sold and disposed of have, after the payment of the fees, costs, and  
expenses incurred by reason of the holding of the Commission of  
Escheat and sale thereof respectively, and after the making of certain  
other payments out of the proceeds of such sale, produced the sums  
of money set forth in the said Schedule, which sums of money have  
been deposited in the Treasury and now stand in the Books of the  
Treasurer to the credit of the estates of the persons deceased, whose  
property they formerly were :

And whereas it is expedient and desirable that all the said sums of  
money should be applied in aid of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for  
the Year 1896 :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*,  
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and  
House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

There shall be applied, for and in aid of the Consolidated Revenue Appropriation of  
Fund of the Colony of *Tasmania*, for the Year 1896, the sums of sums named in  
money mentioned and set forth in the Schedule hereto opposite the Schedule.
