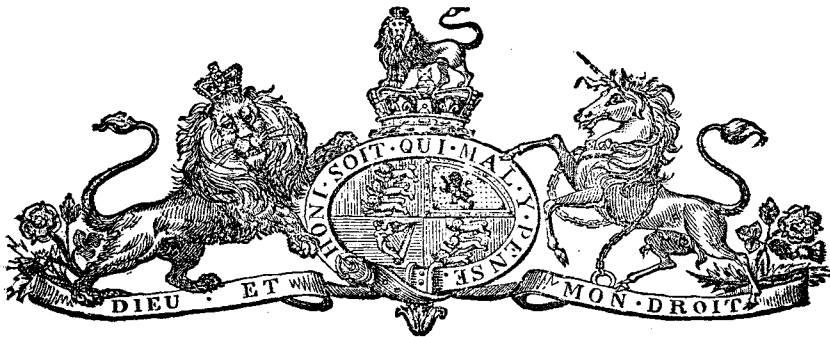

AN ACT to amend "The Common Law Procedure Act" so far as respects the Terms and Sittings of the Supreme Court of *Tasmania*. A.D. 1877.
[19 November, 1877.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to alter the Period of Vacation mentioned in the One hundred and ninety-seventh Section of "The Common Law Procedure Act :—" PREAMBLE.

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 No Term shall be holden by the Supreme Court of *Tasmania*, nor shall any Sittings thereof for the trial of Civil Issues or Assessment of Damages be appointed to commence, between the Eighteenth day of *December* in any year and the Twenty-sixth day of *February* in any succeeding year. No Terms or sittings between 18 *December* and 26 *February* following.

2 The enactment contained in the One hundred and ninety-eighth Section of "The Common Law Procedure Act" shall be subject to the provision contained in the First Section of this Act. Sect. 198 of 18 Vict. No. 9, to be subject to this Act.

3 The One hundred and ninety-seventh Section of "The Common Law Procedure Act," and the Act of the Parliament of *Tasmania* of the 21st *Victoria*, No. 46, are hereby repealed; but this repeal shall not affect anything lawfully done thereunder before the commencement of this Act. Repeal.
