

AN ACT to authorise the raising of the Sum of £33,700, by Debentures chargeable on the General Revenue of *Tasmania*, for making good the Supplies for the Public Service of the Year 1861 and the Excesses of Expenditure on certain Public Works. [1 *February*, 1862.]

WHEREAS the Revenue of the Year 1861 was insufficient to meet the Supplies granted for the Public Service of that year and the excesses of Expenditure on certain Public Works, and the sum of £33,700 is required for the purpose of making good such Supplies and such excesses; and it is expedient to raise such sum by Loans secured on the General Revenue: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 For the purpose of making good the Supplies appropriated to the Public Service of the Year 1861 and the excesses of Expenditure on certain Public Works, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be raised a sum not exceeding £33,700 in the whole, by the sale and issue of Debentures secured on the General Revenue, in like manner as is prescribed in the Act of Parliament of *Tasmania*, 20 *Victoria*, No. 9, such Debentures to be redeemable as follows; that is to say,—

As to the amount of £5,000 in the year 1867 ;
As to the amount of £5,000 in the year 1868 ;
As to the amount of £5,000 in the year 1869 ;
As to the amount of £5,000 in the year 1870 ;
As to the amount of £5,000 in the year 1871 ;
As to the amount of £5,000 in the year 1872 ;
As to the amount of £3,700 in the year 1873.

2 All and every the clauses, provisions, powers, penalties, forfeitures, and disabilities contained in the said Act of the 20th *Victoria*, No. 9, shall apply and extend to the Debentures to be issued in pursuance of this Bill, as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as if the several clauses, provisions, powers, penalties, forfeitures, and disabilities had been particularly repeated and re-enacted in this Bill.
