AN ACT to further continue *An Act to provide temporarily for the Protection of Imported Game.* A.D. 1877. —
[27 January, 1877.]

WHEREAS by the Act of Parliament of the 39th *Victoria*, No. 19, it was enacted that the Act of Parliament of the 29th *Victoria*, No. 22, should continue and be in force until the end of the First Session of the Parliament of *Tasmania* which should be holden in the year 1877, and no longer: PREAMBLE.

And whereas it is expedient to continue the said Act for a further period:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The Act of Parliament of the 29th *Victoria*, No. 22, intituled *An Act to provide temporarily for the Protection of Imported Game*, shall continue and be in force until the Thirty-first day of *December*, 1877, and no longer. Continues 29 Vict. No. 22, until 31 December, 1877.
