AN ACT to render valid the Jury List for the District of Launceston.

W HEREAS doubts have arisen as to the validity of the List purporting to be the Jury List for the District of Launceston for the now current year and it is highly expedient for the administration of justice that such doubts should be removed—BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by His Excellency Sir John Franklin Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Legislative Council that the said List and all matters and things done in relation thereto by any Court of Quarter Sessions or by any Justices of the Peace or by the Police Magistrate for the District aforesaid or the Sheriff of Van Diemen's Land or any of his Deputies and notwithstanding

the non-feazance of any act matter or thing which might or ought to have been done by any such Court Justices of the Peace Police Magistrate Sheriff or any of his Deputies shall be deemed and taken to be and to have been the Jury List for the District of Launceston for the now current year and to be and to have been as valid for all puposes whatsoever as if the said List had been settled and otherwise dealt with in all respects according to law.

AND BE IT ENACTED that no challenge shall be allowed either to the array or to the polls in any case civil or criminal merely on the ground that a copy of the Jurors' Book for the now current year was not delivered by the Sheriff into the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court during the month of December now last past.
