

AN ACT to vest certain Land in Her Majesty A.D. 1899. the Queen for Defence purposes. [8 December, 1899.]

WHEREAS the piece of Land described in the Schedule hereto PREAMBLE. is vested in Francis Xavier Beechinor and Matthew John Clarke, the Trustees of the property of the Roman Catholic Church in Tasmania, in accordance with the provisions of "The Church of Rome Trustees Act"; and the said Trustees have contracted for the sale thereof to Her Majesty the Queen, for Defence purposes, for the sum of One hundred and fifty Pounds:

And whereas the said Trustees have no power under the said Act to sell the said land :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :---

1 In this Act the expression "the said Trustees" shall mean the Interpretation. said Francis Xavier Beechinor and Matthew John Clarke or others the Trustees for the time being of the property of the Roman Catholic Church in Tasmania :

2 It shall be lawful for the said Trustees to sell, and for the Trustees to sell, Governor, for and on behalf of the Colony of Tasmania, to purchase, for and Governor to defence purposes, the piece of land described in the Schedule hereto, purchase, the said Land. for the sum of One hundred and fifty Pounds.

Land for Defence Purposes.

A.D. 1899.

Land to become vested in Her Majesty the Queen. **3** The said piece of Land and all the estate, right, title, and interest of the said Trustees in and to the same shall, upon the payment of the said sum of One hundred and fifty Pounds to the said Trustees as and for the purchase price thereof, without the necessity of any surrender or connecting title other than this Act, be surrendered to and become vested in and be held, enjoyed, possessed, and used by Her Majesty the Queen for Defence purposes, freed and discharged from all claims and demands by or on the part of the said Trustees or the said Roman Catholic Church in *Tasmania*.

SCHEDULE.

TOWN OF BELLERIVE.

Lots 1, 2 AND 5, SECTION U.

2a. Or. **23**p.

Bounded on the north east by five chains and seventy-nine links south-easterly along Gunning-street commencing at the angle of that street with Abbott street, on the south east by seven chains and twenty-two links south-westerly along Crown land, on the south west by one chain and ninety-four links north-westerly along the Esplanade on the River Derwent, on the north west by four chains and seventy-nine links north-easterly along Lot 4 purchased by James Miller, again on the south west by three chains and eighty-six links north-westerly also along that lot and along Lot 3 purchased by Edward Campbell to Abbott-street aforesaid, and thence on the north west by two chains five links and one-half of a link north-easterly along that street to the point of commencement.
