

NURSES' REGISTRATION.

No. 3 of 1966.

AN ACT to amend the *Nurses' Registration Act* 1952. [8 June 1966.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Nurses' Registration Act* 1966. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Nurses' Registration Act* 1952, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section four of the Principal Act is amended—

Constitution of Nurses' Registration Board.

(a) by omitting from subsection (2) thereof the word "nine" and substituting therefor the word "ten";

(b) by omitting from that subsection the word "and", occurring after paragraph (h) thereof; and

(c) by adding at the end of that subsection the following word and paragraph:—

“; and

“(j) A person who appears to the Governor to have had experience as a teacher or in matters relating to education (being a person appointed by the Governor on the recommendation of the Director of Education).”.

3 Section seven of the Principal Act is amended by omitting from subsection (2) thereof the word "four" and substituting therefor the word "five". Proceedings of Board.

DENTISTS.

No. 4 of 1966.

AN ACT to amend the *Dentists Act* 1919. [8 June 1966.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title
and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Dentists Act 1966*.

(2) The *Dentists Act 1919*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Qualifications
for registra-
tion.

2 Section fourteen of the Principal Act is amended—

- (a) by omitting the words “who is a British subject and”;
- (b) by adding at the end of paragraph (a) the word “or”;
- (c) by omitting from paragraph (b) the word “or”;
- (d) by omitting paragraph (c); and
- (e) by adding at the end thereof the following subsections:—

“(2) Any person who has attained the age of twenty-one years and holds a degree in dentistry, dental surgery, or dental science awarded by a university in the Commonwealth or in the Dominion of New Zealand is entitled to be registered as a dentist.

“(3) A person who has attained the age of twenty-one years and holds a qualification prescribed for the purposes of this subsection may apply to the Board for registration and, on such an application, the Board shall, as it considers proper in the circumstances of the case, either register him or require him to be further examined before he is registered.

“(4) The qualifications that may be prescribed for the purposes of subsection (3) of this section are qualifications in dentistry, dental surgery, or dental science obtained at some university or other institution outside the Commonwealth.

“(5) Where the Board has, under subsection (3) of this section, required a person to be further examined before he is registered, it shall, at the request of that person, conduct or arrange for the conduct of the examination, and if that person satisfies the persons by whom he is examined he is entitled to be registered as a dentist.

“(6) A person undergoing an examination referred to in subsection (5) of this section may be required to pay reasonable fees in respect of the examination or to reimburse to the Board the whole or part of the expenses reasonably incurred by it in conducting or arranging for the conduct of the examination, and the Board may refuse to register that person or allow him to undergo the examination unless those fees are paid or that reimbursement is made, as the case may be.”.
