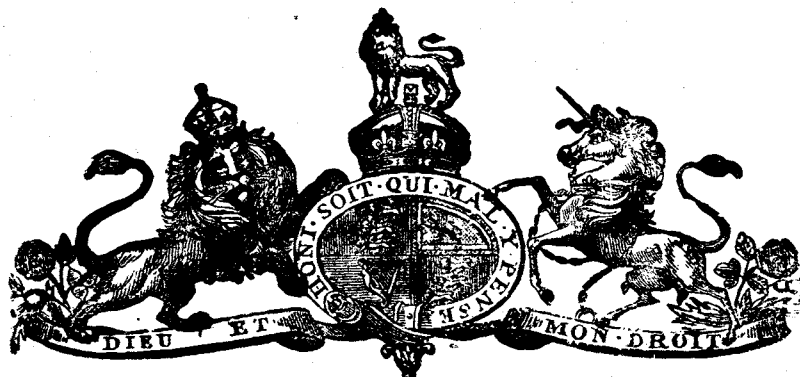

AN ACT to amend "Electrolytic Zinc Com-
 pany's Enabling Act, 1918." A.D. 1920.
 [20 December, 1920.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "Electrolytic Zinc Company's Further Amending Act, 1920," and is incorporated with "The De Bavay's Lease Enabling Act, 1917," "Electrolytic Zinc Company's Enabling Act, 1918," and "The Electrolytic Zinc Company's Amending Act, 1919."

2 Schedule (3) of "Electrolytic Zinc Company's Enabling Act, 1918," is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

Bounded on the south-west by and adjoining the north-eastern portion of the land at Risdon in Tasmania lately conveyed by Henry Purden and Elizabeth Rosina Purden to Edward Herbert Shackell the north-eastern portion of the land lately leased to Amalgamated Zinc (De Bavay's) Limited by the Commissioner of Crown Lands for Tasmania and by part of the north-eastern boundary of a grant to Edward Abbott commencing at the north-western angle of the first-mentioned land on the River Derwent and extending in a south-easterly direction by that river to a point distant Two hundred and five feet south-easterly from the eastern angle of the land lately leased by the Crown to Amalgamated Zinc (De Bavay's) Limited on the south-east by a straight north-easterly line of Five hundred and forty-eight feet bearing north Thirty-seven degrees Six minutes east out into the bed of the said river on the north-east by a straight north-westerly line of One thousand five hundred and eighty-six feet bearing north Fifty-nine degrees Ten minutes west to a point in the bed of the said river thence on the north-west by a straight south-westerly line of Six hundred and forty-nine feet bearing south Thirty-seven degrees Twenty-five minutes west to the point of commencement."
