AN ACT to enable the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Hobart to borrow any Sum or Sums of Money, not exceeding One thousand five hundred Pounds, for the purpose of purchasing a Site and erecting and equipping a Child Welfare Clinic at North Hobart, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the Corporation of Hobart should be empowered to borrow the sum or sums of money hereinafter specified for the purposes hereinafter set forth :

Preamble.

Hobart Corporation Loans.

A.D. 1936. — Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Short title. **1** This Act may be cited as the *Hobart Corporation Loans Act 1936*.

Interpretation. **2** In this Act, unless the context otherwise determines—
 “The Corporation” means the Lord Mayor, aldermen, and citizens of the City of Hobart: and
 “The Council” means the Hobart City Council.

Power to borrow for certain purposes. **3** It shall be lawful for the Corporation, from time to time, to borrow and take up at interest, on the security of the whole of the revenues of the Corporation, such sum or sums of money as the Corporation deems necessary for the purpose hereinafter in this section set forth, not exceeding the sum of money herein mentioned in respect of such purpose :—

For the purchase of land adjoining property
 No. 27 Strahan Street, in the City of Hobart,
 and for erecting and equipping a child welfare
 clinic thereon, not exceeding £1500

Incorporation of 21 Geo. V. No. 32. **4** The provisions of the *Hobart Corporation Securities Act 1930*, are hereby incorporated with this Act, and all moneys authorised to be borrowed hereunder may be borrowed under, and subject to, the provisions thereof.
