MAINTENANCE.

No. 48 of 1968.

AN ACT to amend the Maintenance Act 1967.

[29 October 1968.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Maintenance Act 1968.
- (2) The Maintenance Act 1967 is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2 Section twenty-two of the Principal Act is amended by Preliminary omitting from subsection (1) the word "Division" and substituting therefor the word "Part".

3 Section twenty-three of the Principal Act is amended by Interim omitting from subsection (1) the word "Division" and sub-maintenance. stituting therefor the word "Part".

CONSTITUTION (DISQUALIFICATION REMOVAL).

No. 49 of 1968.

AN ACT to make provision with respect to the validation of the election of the Honourable John Raymond Orchard as a member of the Legislative Council and his sitting and voting as a member thereof. 112 November 1968.1

IA/HEREAS by section thirty-three of the Constitution Act Preamble. 1934 a person who in certain circumstances is interested in contracts or agreements with the Government of the State as defined therein is rendered incapable of sitting or voting as a member of either House of Parliament and, by section thirty-five of that Act the election and return of such a person as a member of either House of Parliament is void:

And whereas by reason of his interest in certain contracts entered into by Telegraph Printery Pty. Ltd., Telegraph Publications Pty. Ltd. and Tourist Publicity (Tasmania) Pty. Ltd., doubts have arisen as to the validity of the last election of the Honourable John Raymond Orchard as a member of the Legislative Council and as to his capacity to sit and vote as a member thereof:

And whereas it is expedient that those doubts should be removed as in this Act provided:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-
