MARINE BOARD OF HOBART (VALIDATION OF EXPENDITURE).

No. 18 of 1956.

AN ACT to validate the expenditure by the Marine Board of Hobart of certain moneys in excess of the amount authorized to be expended by the *Marine Act* 1921. [16 May 1956.]

WHEREAS by section seventy-five of the *Marine Act* 1921 Preamble. it is provided that the revenues of a marine board or harbour trust shall be applied or expended for or upon certain purposes and matters specified in that section:

And whereas by paragraph v of that section a marine board or harbour trust is authorized to apply or expend moneys out of its revenues, upon any extraordinary expenditure which it may consider to be directly or indirectly connected with its work, subject to certain conditions, including a limit upon the sum that may be so applied or expended in any one financial year:

And whereas during the financial year that ended on the thirtieth day of June 1954, the Marine Board of Hobart expended by way of contribution to the Sesquicentennial Committee established under the Sesquicentenary Act 1949 towards the erection of a memorial on Hunter Wharf in the city of Hobart in commemoration of the landing at Sullivan's Cove on the River Derwent of Lieutenant David Collins, the sum of five hundred pounds, which, together with other moneys applied by that Board by way of extraordinary expenditure during that financial year, brought the total sum applied by that Board by way of extraordinary expenditure during that financial year to the sum of six hundred and sixty-eight pounds five shillings and one penny:

And whereas by virtue of paragraph v of section seventy-five of the *Marine Act* 1921, as in force at the relevant time, the total sum that could be applied by that Board by way of extraordinary expenditure during any one financial year was the sum of five hundred pounds:

And whereas it is desirable to validate the excess expenditure of that Board during that financial year:

BE it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and incorporation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Marine Board of Hobart (Validation of Expenditure) Act 1956.
- (2) This Act is incorporated, and shall be read as one, with the *Marine Act* 1921 (in this Act referred to as the Principal Act).

Validation of certain expenditure.

2 Notwithstanding anything in the Principal Act, as in force during the financial year that ended on the thirtieth day of June 1954, the Marine Board of Hobart shall be deemed at all times during that financial year, to have had power to expend, out of the revenues of the Board, by way of extraordinary expenditure under paragraph v of section seventy-five of that Act, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of six hundred and sixty-eight pounds five shillings and one penny, and the sum so expended by that Board during that financial year is validated accordingly.

EDUCATION.

No. 19 of 1956.

AN ACT to amend the Education Act 1932. [16 May 1956.]

B^E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Education Act 1956.
- (2) The *Education Act* 1932, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Local advisory committees. **2** Section nineteen C of the Principal Act is amended by omitting therefrom the word "secondary" and substituting therefor the word "tertiary".
