AN ACT to provide for the Exemption of Lessees and Licensees on Active Service from Covenants in relation to Leases and Licences under the *Mining Act* 1929. [27 June, 1940.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Mining Covenants Exemption Act* 1940.

(2) This Act shall be incorporated and read as one with the *Mining Act* 1929.

*Mining Covenants Exemption.*

- A.D. 1940. **2** In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—  
 Interpretation. “Active service” means service, outside the Commonwealth, with any of His Majesty’s military, naval, or air forces.
- Power of Governor to grant exemption from covenants to certain lessees or licensees. **3** Where the holder of any lease or licence (other than a prospector’s licence) under the *Mining Act 1929*, is engaged on active service in connection with the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged (in this Act called “the present war”), the Governor may grant exemption to such holder from all or any of the covenants of such lease or licence, to such extent and for such period during the continuance of this Act, and upon such conditions, if any, as the Governor may think fit.
- Act to extend to applications made before commencement of Act. **4** The provisions of section three shall extend to any application for a lease or licence received by the Secretary before the commencement of this Act.
- Duration of Act. **5** This Act shall continue in operation during the continuance of the present war, and for a period of twelve months thereafter.
