BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Public Service Act 1946*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Public Service Act 1923**, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

2—(1) During the continuance of this section the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, fill any vacancy occurring in any office by the transfer or promotion thereto of any officer who, during the war, was engaged on war service outside this State as a member of any of His Majesty's naval, military, or air forces and whose age, at the date upon which he enlisted in, or was appointed to, or was called up for service with, such forces, did not exceed twenty-one years, notwithstanding that the occurrence of the vacancy has not been notified as required by section thirty-three of the Principal Act.

(2) In this section, "the war" means the war which commenced on the third day of September, 1939, and includes any other war in which His Majesty became engaged after that date and before the commencement of this section.

(3) This section shall cease to have effect on the thirty-first day of December, 1947.
