

**PUBLIC WORKS EXECUTION (No. 3).**

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**No. 85 of 1953.**

AN ACT to provide for the execution and carrying out of certain public works and purposes, and to authorize the borrowing of certain sums of money for meeting the cost of those works and purposes, and to amend the *Public Works Execution Act (No. 2) 1953*.  
[9 December, 1953.]

**BE** it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**PART I.****PRELIMINARY.**

Short title.

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Public Works Execution Act (No. 3) 1953*.

**PART II.****PUBLIC WORKS AND PURPOSES GENERALLY.**

Works and purposes to be executed and carried out.

**2**—(1) The public works and purposes that are specified in the schedule may be executed and carried out by the Minister administering the Act or Department under or for the purposes of which those works and purposes are respectively required to be executed or carried out.

(2) The cost of a public work or purpose that is specified in the schedule shall not exceed the amount set forth therein in respect of that work or purpose.

Power to Treasurer to borrow £968,363.

**3** The Treasurer may borrow any sums of money, not exceeding £968,363, and may apply the sums so borrowed for the purpose of meeting the cost of the execution and carrying out of the public works and purposes that are specified in the schedule.

- (a) by omitting from paragraph (a) of section three the numerals “£2,944,842 17s. 8d.” and substituting therefor the numerals “£2,962,342 17s. 8d.”;
- (b) by omitting from section four the numerals “£174,900” and substituting therefore the numerals “£157,400”;
- (c) by inserting after item 63 in the first schedule, under the heading “Public Works Department—”, the following item:—  
“63A. Road works in connection with Kettering-Barnes Bay, Bruny Island, Ferry Service, £17,500”;
- (d) by omitting the numerals “£419,631” at the end of the first schedule and substituting therefor the numerals “£432,131”;
- (e) by omitting item 90 from the second schedule;
- (f) by omitting the numerals “£174,900” at the end of the second schedule and substituting therefor the numerals “£157,400”; and
- (g) by omitting from the summary the numerals “419,631” and the numerals “174,900” and substituting therefore respectively the numerals “432,131” and “157,400”.

(2) This section shall be deemed to have commenced on the date of the commencement of the *Public Works Execution Act (No. 2) 1953*.
