

- 1. Short title.
- 2. Issue and application of £710,669 13s. 6d.
- 3. Appropriation of supplies.

AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the 1933. Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for that Year in this Session of Parliament. [18 December, 1933.]

DE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as "The Appropriation Act, 1933-34." Short title.

A.D. 1933.

Issue and application of £710,669 13s. 6d.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, the sum of Seven hundred and ten thousand six hundred and sixty-nine Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Sixpence.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 All sums granted by this Act, and the Supply Act, 1933-34, and the Supply Act (No. 2), 1933-34, out of the Consolidated Revenue 24 Geo. V. No. 3. towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting, 24 Geo. V. No. 7. as appears by the First Schedule to this Act, in the aggregate to the sum of One million three hundred and sixty-three thousand and forty-nine Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Sixpence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of those Acts for the purposes and services expressed in the Second Schedule to this Act.
