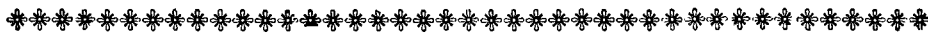

AN ACT to make more effectual provision for Paving the Streets and other Public Places in the City of *Hobart Town*.

[20 February, 1867.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 Whenever the Municipal Council of the City of *Hobart Town* cause the footways or any part thereof of any street or any public place to be made, formed, paved, and flagged in such manner as the said Council sees fit, One half of the expense incurred thereby shall be repaid to such Municipal Council by the owners of the lands abutting on such street or public place or portion thereof so made, formed, paved, and flagged ; and if such owner refuses or neglects to pay the same within One month after the same has been demanded, the same shall be recovered in the same way as any Municipal Rate is now recoverable by Law ; and such footway shall afterwards be repaired and kept in repair by the said Municipal Council.

Half the expense of paving the footways of streets to be borne by owners of lands abutting thereon.

2 In the construction of this Act the word "Owner" shall have the meaning assigned to such word in the Fourth Section of *The Police Act*, 1865.

Construction of the word "Owner."

3 This Act and *The Hobart Town Corporation Act* and *The Police Act*, 1865, so far as the said last-mentioned Act applies to the City of *Hobart Town*, shall be read and construed together as one and the same Act.

Acts to be read together.

4 In referring to this Act it shall be sufficient to use the expression *The Hobart Town Paving Act*.
