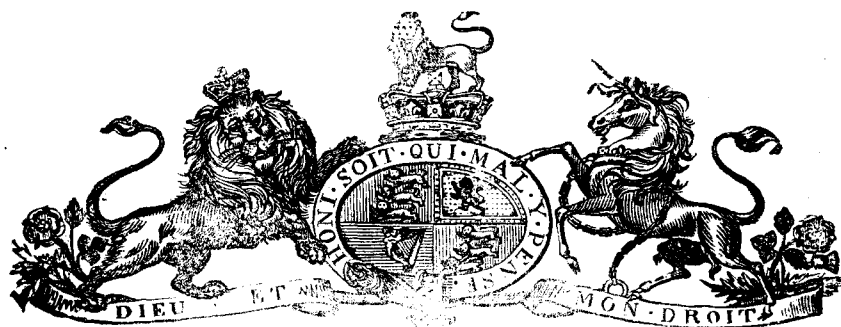

AN ACT to amend "The *Launceston and Western Railway Act, 1873.*" A.D. 1883.
[29 October, 1883.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 It shall be lawful for the Minister of Lands and Works for the time being to lay down or cause to be laid down an additional Rail or Rails upon and along any part or parts of the *Launceston and Western Railway*, so as to enable such Railway to be used for engines and rolling-stock constructed for a gauge of Three feet and Six inches, and for that purpose to make such alterations in the said Railway as may be necessary. Power to lay down additional Rail.

2 The cost of laying down such additional Rail or Rails, and of making such alterations as are hereinbefore mentioned, and of generally effecting the purposes of this Act, shall be appropriated out of moneys provided by Parliament for that purpose; but such cost shall not exceed the sum of Nineteen thousand Pounds. Cost how borne.

3 Nothing hereinbefore contained shall in any way affect any rights of The *Launceston and Western Railway Company (Limited)* under Section Twenty-four of "The *Launceston and Western Railway Act, 1873.*" Rights of Company saved.

4 "The *Launceston and Western Railway Act, 1873,*" as amended by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.

5 This Act may be cited as "The *Launceston and Western Railway Act, 1883.*" Short title.
