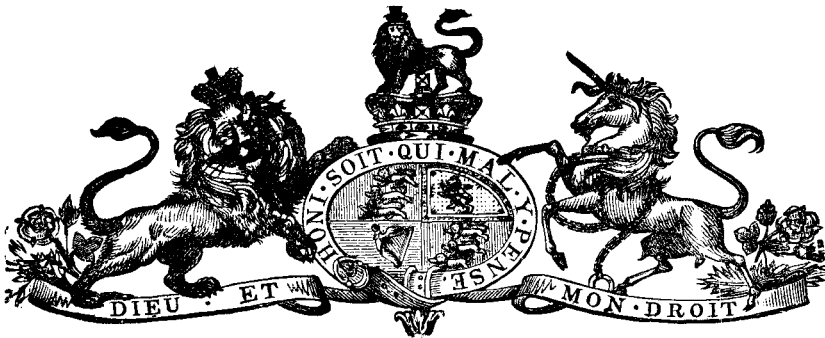

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Interpretation.**2** In this Act, unless the context otherwise indicates—

“The Corporation” means the Corporation and body politic of the Mayor, aldermen, and citizens of the City of Launceston.

**3** It shall be lawful for the Corporation from time to time to borrow and take up at interest such further sum or sums of money not exceeding the sum of Fifty-three thousand Pounds as shall, by the Council, be deemed requisite for any purpose or purposes mentioned in Section Five of the Launceston Sewerage Act, 1914, in addition to the sum of One hundred and ninety-seven thousand Pounds mentioned in Section Four of the Launceston Loans for Various Purposes Act, 1929. And the Launceston Sewerage Act, 1914, shall be read and construed as if the total amount thereby authorised to be borrowed were Two hundred and fifty thousand Pounds instead of One hundred and ninety-seven thousand Pounds as provided by Section Four of the Launceston Loans for Various Purposes Act, 1929.
