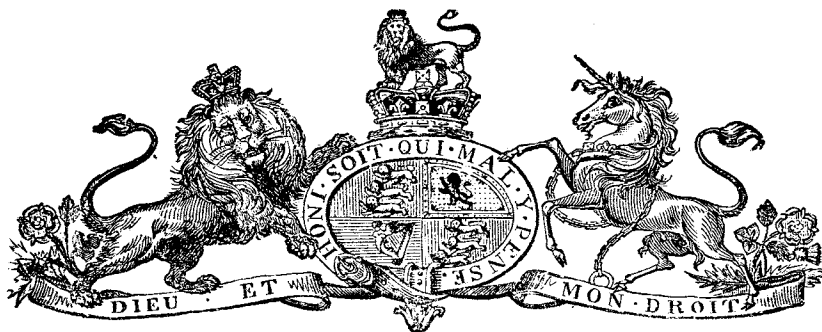

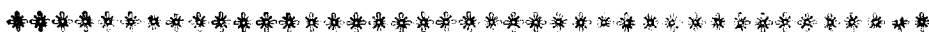

AN ACT to amend "The Military Discipline Act, 1878." A.D. 1883.  
[29 October, 1883.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** In this Act—  
"The said Act" means "The Military Discipline Act, 1878." Interpretation.

**2** In the said Act the word "Force" used therein shall include the Engineer Corps engaged under this Act; and whenever in the said Act "The Mutiny Act" is mentioned it shall be taken to mean the Act of the Imperial Parliament to amend the Law relating to the Discipline and Regulation of the Army. **3** The Governor may engage, upon the terms and conditions contained in the said Act, the services of such a number of persons, not exceeding Seventy-five, to serve in the said Engineer Corps, as Parliament shall from time to time authorise and provide for. Engineer Corps may be engaged.

**4** The provisions contained in Section Twenty of the said Act shall not apply to any member of the said Engineer Corps engaged under this Act. Provisions not to apply to Engineer Corps.

**5** The said Act, as amended by this Act, and this Act, shall be read and construed together as one Act. Acts to be read together.

**6** This Act may be cited as "The Military Discipline Act, 1883." Short title.
