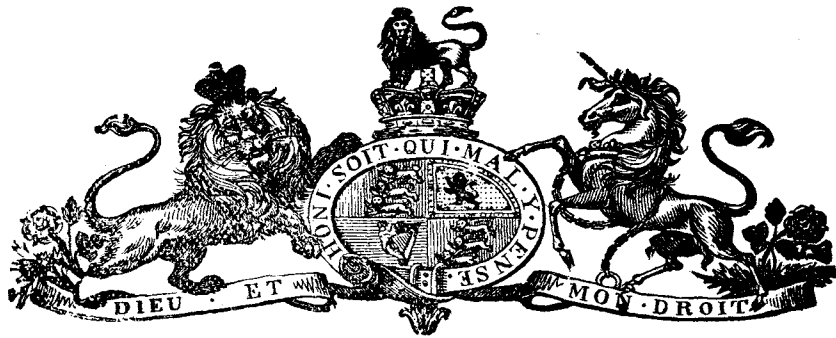

AN ACT to establish a Standard of Time in A.D. 1895.
Tasmania. [23 August, 1895.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to establish a standard of time in PREAMBLE.
Tasmania, and to declare the mean time of the One hundred and
fiftieth meridian of longitude east of *Greenwich*, in *England*, to be such
standard time throughout *Tasmania* :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and
House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 This Act may be cited as “The Standard Time Act, 1895.” Short title.

2 This Act shall commence and take effect on and from the First Commencement
day of *September*, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-five. of Act.
