AN ACT to amend "The Tasmanian Govern- 1924. ment Shipping Act, 1920." [4 August, 1924.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1-(1) This Act may be cited as "The Tasmanian Government Short title. Shipping Act, 1924."
- (2) "The Tasmanian Government Shipping Act, 1920," is herein Principal Act. called "the Principal Act." Principal Act."

Tasmanian Government Shipping.

A.D. 1924.

Amendment of Section 2 of the Principal Act.

- 2 Section Two of the Principal Act is hereby amended by expunging the definition of "General Manager" contained in that section, and substituting the following definition therefor:-
 - "General Manager" means the General Manager of Tasmanian Government Shipping referred to in Section Three of this Act.

Amendment of Section 3 of the Principal Act.

3 Section Three of the Principal Act is hereby amended by deleting all the words in the said section after the word "officer" in the Sixth line thereof and down to the end of the said section, and substituting the words "to be called the General Manager of Tasmanian Government Shipping "therefor.

Repeal of Section Act, and substitation of new section.

- 4 Section Four of the Principal Act is hereby repealed and the 4 of the Principal following section substituted therefor: -
 - "4—(1) The Commissioner for Railways shall be the General Manager.

General Manager.

(2) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the performance by the person holding the office of Commissioner for Railways of his duties as General Manager under this Act, shall not be a ground for the suspension of such person as such Commissioner."

Amendment of Section 6 of the Principal Act.

- 5 Section Six of the Principal Act is hereby amended as follows:—
 - 1. By expunging Subsection (3) thereof, and substituting the following subsection therefor:-
 - "(3) Such Deputy-General Manager and other permanent officers may be paid such salaries or allowances as shall be fixed by the Governor": and
 - II. By inserting the following Subsection (5) after Subsection (4) thereof:—
 - "(5) The General Manager may arrange for any duties or functions under this Act to be performed by an officer of the railway service."

Amendment of Subsection (1) of Section 18 of the Principal Act.

6 Subsection (1) of Section Eighteen of the Principal Act is hereby amended by deleting all the words of the said subsection from and including the word "Where" in the first line thereof down to and including the word "extend" in the fourth line thereof.

Amendment of Section 19 of the Principal Act.

- 7 Subsection (2) of Section Nineteen of the Principal Act is hereby Subsection (2) of amended as follows:
 - t. By deleting the words "sufficient to meet" in the fifth line of the said subsection: and
 - II. By deleting the words "sufficient to meet" in the fourteenth line of the said subsection, and substituting the words "equal to" therefor.

Tasmanian Government Shipping.

8 After Section Twenty-three of the Principal Act the following A.D. 1924. new Section 23a is hereby inserted:-

- "23a—(1) The General Manager may, with the consent of the powers to agent. Minister, delegate to any agent, appointed by him in pursuance of Section Ten of this Act, all or any of the powers and functions conferred on the General Manager by this part of this Act, except this power of delegation: Provided that the nature and extent of any such delegated powers shall be contained in a written agreement duly entered into between the General Manager and any such agent as aforesaid.
- (2) Every delegation under this section shall be revocable at will, and no delegation shall prevent the exercise of any power or function by the General Manager."
