Evidence (Unsworn Evidence) Bill

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Bill amends the Evidence Act 1958, the Crimes Act 1958 and the Magistrates' Court Act 1989, abolishing the right to give unsworn evidence or make unsworn statements.

Clause 1 sets out the purposes of the Act.

Clause 2 provides for the Act to come into operation on the day on which it receives Royal Assent.

Clause 3 abolishes the right to make unsworn statements or to give unsworn evidence.

Clause 4 makes consequential amendments to the Crimes Act.

Clause 5 makes consequential amendments to the Magistrates' Court Act.

Clause 6 is a statute law revision amendment.

Clause 7 is a transitional provision stating that the Act applies to all trials yet to occur irrespective of when the offences themselves occurred.
