Motor Car Traders Bill EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

PART 1-PRELIMINARY

Clause 1 contains the purpose of the Act.

Clause 2 provides for the coming into operation of the Act.

Clause 3 contains the definitions to be applied under the Act.

Clause 4 provides for certain transactions to be subject to the Act.

Clause 5 provides that in certain circumstances a person is deemed to be a motor car trader.

Clause 6 excludes the application of the Second-hand Dealers Act 1958 to licensed motor car traders.

PART 2-LICENCES

Clause 7 requires motor car traders to be licensed.

Clause 8 provides for the manner for applying for a licence.

Clause 9 provides for the refund of the licence fee where the application is withdrawn prior to consideration by the Authority.

Clause 10 prohibits false or misleading statements in relation to a licence application and provides a defence to a prosecution.

Clause 11 provides for a copy of the licence application to be given to the Director and Chief Commissioner of Police in order to conduct enquiries.

Clause 12 enables the Director and Chief Commissioner of Police to object to the granting of a licence.

Clause 13 provides for the grounds on which the Motor Car Traders Licensing Authority will grant or refuse to grant a licence.

Clause 14 enables the Authority to impose conditions or restrictions on a licence.

Clause 15 provides for the endorsement of conditions or restrictions on the licence.

Clause 16 contains special procedures granting authority to sell motor cars by public auction.

Clause 17 provides for the name under which a licensed motor car trader may operate.

Clause 18 provides for the form of licence.

Clause 19 requires application for a new licence where there has been a change in partnership.

Clause 20 requires a licensee to give notice of certain changes.

Clause 21 requires a licence to be returned in certain circumstances.

Clause 22 provides for the keeping of a Register of Motor Car Traders.

Clause 23 provides for the period of a licence.

Clause 24 contains procedures for the renewal of a licence.

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Clause 25 requires motor car traders to prominently display the licence or a copy at each place of business.

Clause 26 provides for the issue of a duplicate licence in certain circumstances.

Clause 27 provides for the surrender of a licence.

Clause 28 provides for the cancellation or suspension of a licence.

Clause 29 provides for the effect of a suspension of a licence.

Clause 30 contains the grounds for taking disciplinary action against a licensee.

Clause 31 provides for the disciplinary measures which the Authority may take.

Clause 32 provides for a review of certain decisions of the Authority by the Administrative Appeals Tribunal.

Clause 33 contains procedures in the case of the death, disability etc. of a licensee.

Clause 34 requires a licensee to display a sign in the prescribed form.

PART 3—CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

Clause 35 requires motor car traders to keep a dealings book at each trade premises, prohibits the making of false or misleading entries and prohibits a person giving false information to a motor car trader on matters covered by the Act.

Clause 36 prohibits consignment selling by a motor car trader.

Clause 37 prohibits motor car traders from dealing with young persons.

Clause 38 prohibits odometer tampering.

Clause 39 enables the court to make orders for compensation in certain cases.

Clause 40 provides for findings in proceedings against odometer tampering to be evidence in certain actions.

Clause 41 contains requirements regarding agreements for the sale of used motor cars.

Clause 42 contains requirements regarding agreements for the sale of new motor cars.

Clause 43 provides for a cooling-off period in certain circumstances.

Clause 44 prohibits motor car traders entering particular agreements for the sale of used motor cars.

Clause 45 provides for the rescission of an agreement for the sale of a motor car in certain circumstances.

Clause 46 provides for the powers and functions of the Small Claims Tribunals in an application for rescission.

Clause 47 provides for the powers of a Magistrates' Court or a Small Claims Tribunal in an application for rescission.

Clause 48 prohibits a motor car trader from selling a motor car without first cancelling any security interest in the vehicle.

Clause 49 requires a financier to notify the Registrar of the failure of a motor car trader to cancel a security interest.

Clause 50 provides for the proceeds of a sale or disposal to be held in trust in certain circumstances.

PART 4—SALE OF USED MOTOR CARS

Clause 51 is an interpretation clause for this Part.

Clause 52 requires motor car traders to display certain particulars on vehicles offered for sale.

Clause 53 contains certain requirements relating to the sale of unregistered vehicles by motor car traders.

Clause 54 contains certain requirements relating to the obligations of motor car traders in particular, the statutory warranty.

Clause 55 provides for the display of a prescribed notice excluding certain defects from the statutory warranty.

Clause 56 prohibits any special conditions purporting to limit or modify the obligations of a motor car trader.

PART 5-MOTOR CAR TRADERS' GUARANTEE FUND AND CLAIMS COMMITTEE

Clause 57 provides for the establishment of the Guarantee Fund Claims Committee.

Clause 58 provides for the terms and conditions of appointment of members of the Committee.

Clause 59 provides for allowances to be paid to members of the Committee.

Clause 60 provides for the resignation or removal from office of members of the Committee.

Clause 61 provides for the appointment of an acting chairperson to the Committee.

Clause 62 provides for the appointment of a Secretary to the Committee.

Clause 63 provides that an act or determination of the Committee is not invalid by reason of a vacancy or irregularity in the appointment of a member.

Clause 64 enables the Chairperson to give directions for the expeditious and just hearing of any proceedings before the Committee.

Clause 65 provides for fixing of the time and place for hearings.

Clause 66 provides for the constitution of the Committee in determining claims.

Clause 67 provides for the determination of questions before the Committee.

Clause 68 provides for the appearance of a claimant before the Committee.

Clause 69 provides for the giving of evidence before the Committee.

Clause 70 provides for procedures of the Committee.

Clause 71 enables persons to request a written copy of the reasons for a determination.

Clause 72 prohibits contempt of the Committee.

Clause 73 provides for protection for the members of the Committee and the Secretary for things done in the execution of the Act.

Clause 74 establishes the Motor Car Traders Guarantee Fund and provides for payments into and out of the Fund.

Clause 75 provides for the powers and duties of the Treasurer in relation to the Fund.

Clause 76 contains the grounds upon which a claim may be made against the Fund.

Clause 77 contains the procedures for admitting or refusing a claim.

Clause 78 provides that if a claim is admitted, no further claim may be made in respect of the same matter.

Clause 79 provides for appeals to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal against the Committee's refusal to admit a claim.

Clause 80 provides for the rights of subrogation where claims have been paid.

Clause 81 enables deferred payment of claims to be made in some circumstances.

PART 6-MISCELLANEOUS

Clause 82 provides for the powers of inspection.

Clause 83 prohibits a motor car trader or agent of a motor car trader from selling or exchanging motor cars without disclosing that the person is a motor car trader.

Clause 84 makes it an offence for motor car traders to place certain advertisements.

Clause 85 provides for the responsibilities and liabilities of officers of bodies corporate.

Clause 86 provides for the the service of notices.

Clause 87 provides for certificates to be signed by the Registrar to be evidence of the matter stated therein.

Clause 88 prohibits any attempt to exclude, limit or modify the operation of the Act.

Clause 89 provides that nothing in the Act limits, restricts or otherwise affects the rights or remedies a person may have.

Clause 90 allows the Governor in Council to make regulations.

PART 7-MOTOR CAR TRADERS LICENSING AUTHORITY

Clause 91 provides for the establishment of the Motor Car Traders Licensing Authority.

Clause 92 contains the qualifications necessary for appointment as Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson.

Clause 93 provides for the terms and conditions of appointment of the Chairperson, Deputy Chairperson and members of the Authority.

Clause 94 provides for allowances to be paid to members of the Authority.

Clause 95 provides for the resignation or removal from office of members of the Authority.

Clause 96 provides for the appointment of an acting chairperson or Deputy Chairperson of the Authority.

Clause 97 provides for the appointment of acting members of the Authority.

Clause 98 provides that an act or determination of the Authority is not invalid by reason of a vacancy or irregularity in the appointment of a member.

Clause 99 enables the Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson to give directions for the expeditious and just hearing of any proceedings before the Authority.

Clause 100 provides for the use of experts in certain circumstances.

Clause 101 provides for fixing of the time and place for hearings before the Authority.

Clause 102 provides for the constitution of the Authority.

Clause 103 provides for the determination of questions before the Authority.

Clause 104 provides for the appearance of persons before the Authority.

Clause 105 provides for the giving of evidence before the Authority.

Clause 106 provides for procedures of the Authority.

Clause 107 provides that costs are not allowed in any proceedings before the Authority.

Clause 108 provides for the determination of questions of law by the Supreme Court.

Clause 109 provides for the appointment of a Registrar and staff to the Authority.

Clause 110 enables persons to request a written copy of the reasons for a determination.

Clause 111 requires the Director to give effect to a determination of the Authority.

Clause 112 allows the Authority to request the Director to investigate matters.

Clause 113 enables the Authority to extend any time limit for actions under the Act.

Clause 114 prohibits contempt of the Authority.

Clause 115 provides for a certificate signed by the Registrar to be received by courts as evidence of the matters certified.

Clause 116 contains a secrecy provision.

Clause 117 provides protection for the Authority, the Registrar or Deputy Registrar for things done in executing the Act.

PART 8—TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS AND CONSEQUENTIAL AMENDMENTS

Clause 118 contains transitional provisions relating to licences.

Clause 119 contains transitional provisions relating to hearings before the Motor Car Traders Committee.

Clause 120 contains transitional provisions regarding the right of subrogation.

Clause 121 provides for the repeal of the Motor Car Traders Act 1973.

Clause 122 provides for consequential amendments.

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
