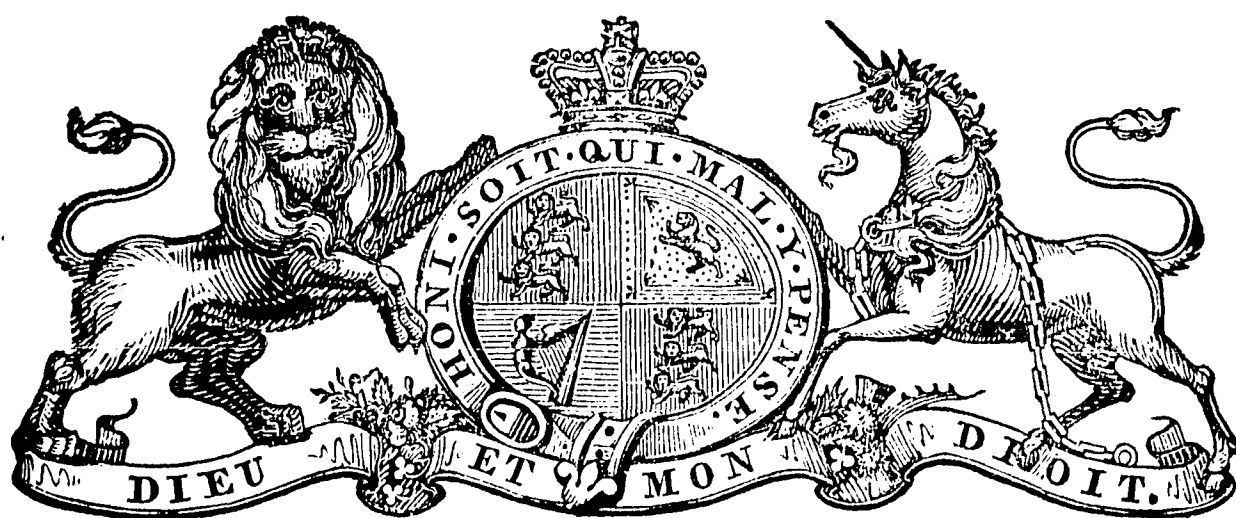

An Act to amend an Act intituled "*An Act to regulate the Conveyance of Passengers to Victoria.*" [19th March, 1862.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty and numbered five intituled "*An Act to regulate the Conveyance of Passengers to Victoria*" Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

Preamble.

18 Vic. No. 5.

I. So much of the eleventh section of the said Act as provides that the master of every ship shall pay a rate of five shillings for every statute adult arrived in such ship and that no entry of such ship shall be made or have any legal effect whatever until such payment shall have been made and the whole of the twelfth section shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Part of sec. 11 as to passenger rates and section 12 repealed.
