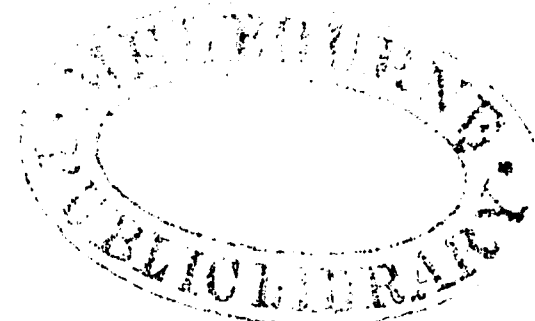
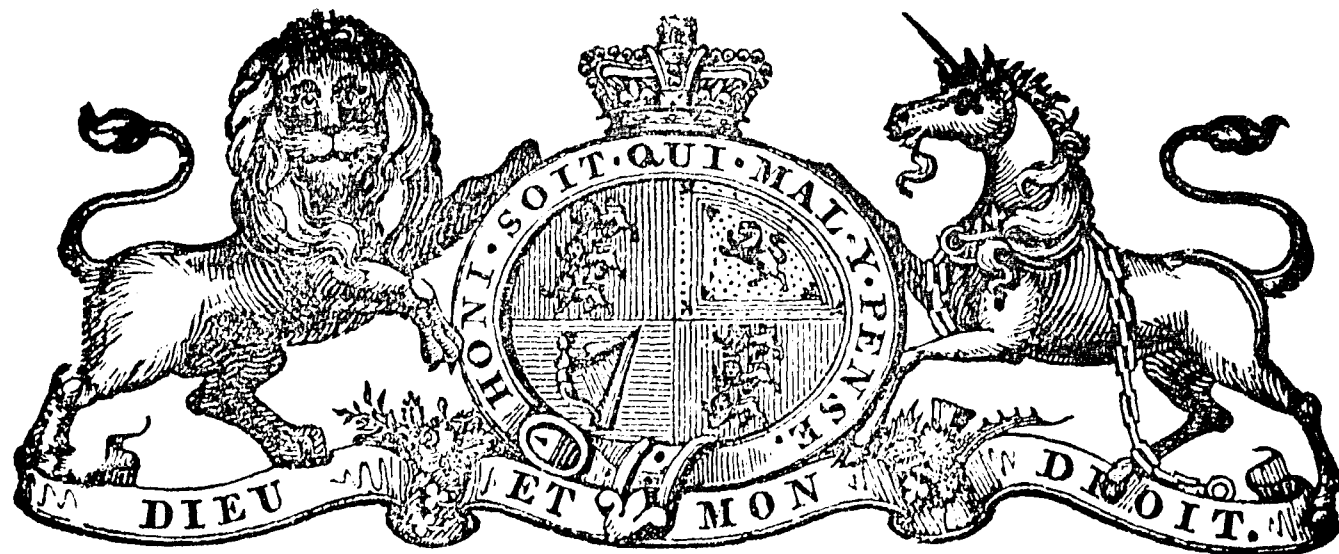

No. DCXXVIII.

An Act to amend the Lunacy Statute.
[28th November 1878.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in section ten of "*The Lunacy Statute*" numbered CCCIX. it shall not be lawful for any justice or justices after the first day of October One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine to make any order upon the council of any city town borough or shire in which any lunatic may be found for the payment of any remuneration either for the medical examination conveyance of or any other expenses incurred in connection with any such lunatic.

After 1st October 1879 no order to be made for payment by municipalities of expenses for medical examination or conveyance of lunatics.
